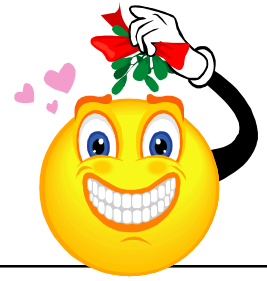

Here's the plan -- If you want to come by boat and stay Saturday and/or Sunday nights, we have space to moor boats. Some covered & some not. Call us @ 503-543-7344 and let us know if you're coming by boat & which nights you want to stay.

If you are coming by land here are directions from Portland area:

Follow Hwy. 30 toward Scappoose/St. Helens. Watch the mile markers on the road. Marker 19 is at the driveway of a Shell station on your right. Johnson Landing Road is the road just past the station. Turn right & follow it toward the channel. At Brown's Landing the road turns to the left and becomes Dike Road. Go about 1/4 mile to the first covered walkway going up the side of the dike. The parking lot is across the road from the walkway. On the right side of the walkway is a sign--

On top of the dike there's a board walk that takes you to a gate. If the gate is locked, there is a red button to the right of it. Push that button, & we can let you in. Come down the ramp & straight ahead until you see an "Office" sign.


























We'll have snacks/munchies in our house from around noon on. The Gump's will have chili & corn-bread on their boat, also. If you would like to -- bring your favorite snack or drink to share. If you want to be out on the dock to watch the show, bring rain gear. You know Oregon weather in December.

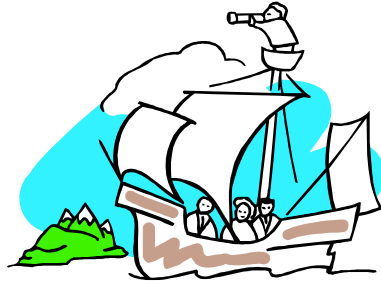
