It was good to see so many of you at the last general meeting; Cruise Planning, it would be nice to fill the place like that every month.

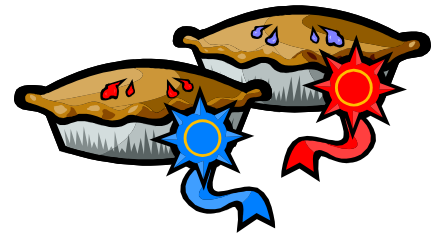
I would like to send a big THANK YOU to Grandma (Lenore) for the wonderful pie's. How about a Lemon Meringue at the October 24th meeting.






Thank You

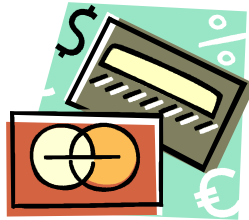
Horse Race
