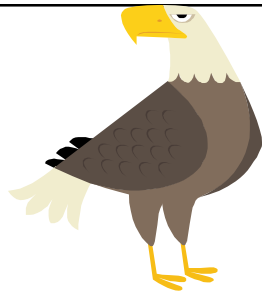

Leaving Shafer you will go back to Forest Grove, through Cornelius and turn south on 10th St, follow 10th and it will turn into Golf Course Road. When the road ends you are at Forest Hills Golf Course and you will take a left, and at the next road go right onto Johnson School Road. The Arganbrights are at 34950 SW Johnson School Rd., Cornelius. It is the 5th house on the right.

You may just come to the vineyard or just come for lunch at the Arganbrights at about noon. Both locations will provide a great getaway to the country.

I was recently at a cruise with another club when one of the club members decided to visit another boat it was very close to dark when she attempted to step on the swim platform and missed consequently she fell in with no life jacket on the current swept her down stream luckily one of the other members had heard the commotion and was able to assist grabbing a life ring which was present on his boat and he was able to throw it to her the problem was their was no rope tied to it thankfully she caught it and was able to grab the rope that was thrown next. She was able to be pulled back to the end of the dock and was lifted out of the water all was well if not for the fast acting club member she probably would of been lost. As a reminder water safety can not be stressed enough. I'm proposing that our club have a easily assessable life ring posted on the dock with life line and also a portable spot light that could assist in possible recovery of someone in the water and anything else that might help I'm open to suggestions from anyone that has thoughts and or ideas. I also would like to propose a life ring throwing exercise at one of our cruises.
